FALL ORDEAL



Weather was perfect, and the thunder stayed far enough away to keep us moving but not be in danger. Next up was NOAC, where four delegates and seven staff members were able to hear about upcoming changes within OA. Two big announcements were made concerning American Indian Affairs (we'll need to have an agreement with a local tribe in the future) and the OA's new vision, mission, and purpose. Finally, we just finished the Section ACT retreat at Camp Lumpkin, which is a weekend of fellowship at the section level along with youth and adult training events.
